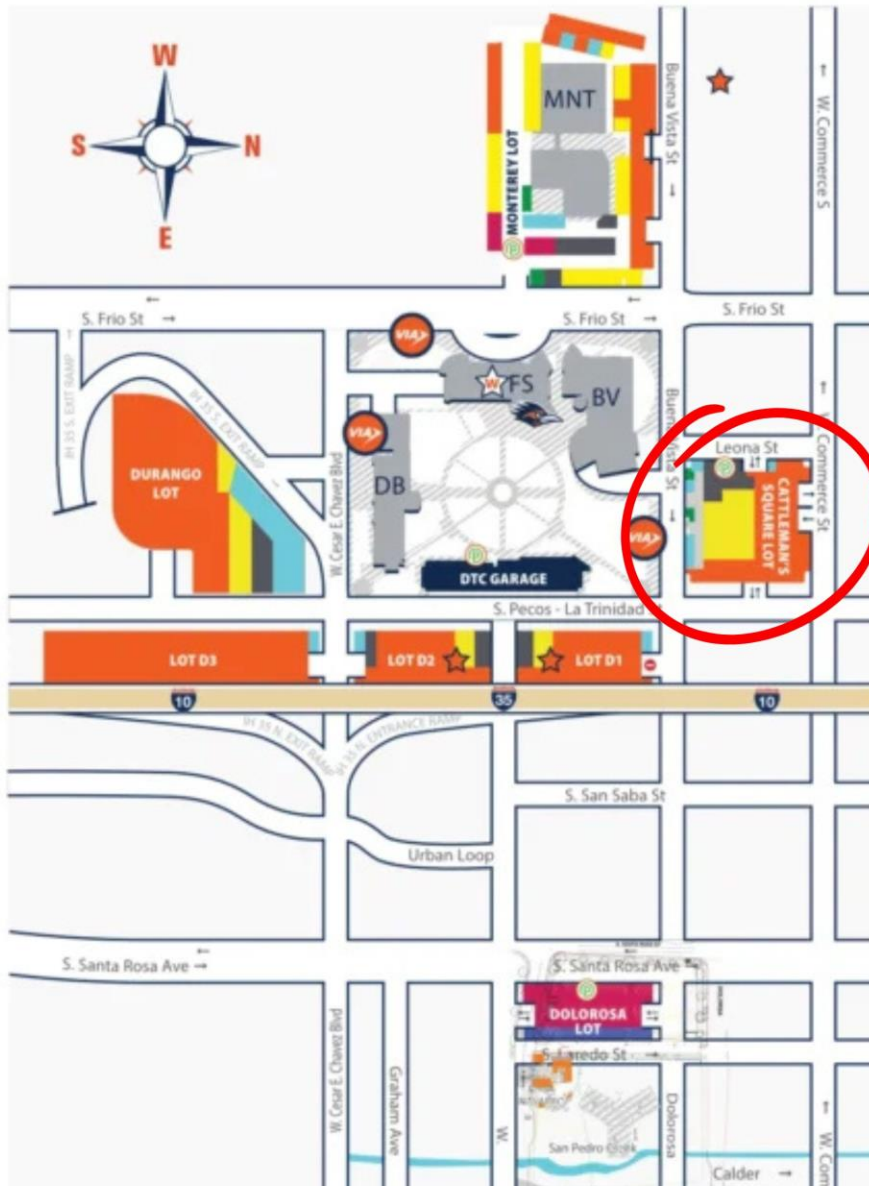
VIA U-Pass
